

**Hobart Township Monthly Meeting  
November 9, 2010**

**Present:** Ray Sonnenberg, DuWayne Sonnenberg, Terry Hockett, Debi Moltzan, Kathy Glawe, Doug Harthan, Jim Reiber and Jeff Stabnow.

Chairman Hockett called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. R Sonnenberg made a motion to approve the minutes from the October 12, 2010 meeting. D Sonnenberg second. All in favor. Motion carried.

Glawe gave the Treasurer's Report. D Sonnenberg made a motion to approve the disbursements as read. R Sonnenberg second. All in favor. Motion carried.

D Sonnenberg gave an update on the condition of the road going into Kent Adam's subdivision. Moltzan stated that she has not had any response to the letters sent out to the landowners along the road regarding their input concerning road access, acceptance of the new road and vacation of the old road.

Stabnow gave an update on the East Lake Seven Road and suggested that Tim Courneya's mailbox should be moved and replaced with a swing away post. Stabnow discussed surveying the road right of ways and wanted to know which sections should be done first. Stabnow stated that he could inventory the road signs to see which ones needed to be replaced and which ones needed to be removed. The inventory must be done by 2012, posts replaced by 2013 and signs replaced by 2015. Stabnow could do the inventory for \$1600.00.

R Sonnenberg made a motion to have Stabow go ahead and inventory the signs in the township. D Sonnenberg second. All in favor. Motion carried.

Reiber and Harthan, Perham EMS, were present to discuss the future of the Perham Emergency Medical Service and stated that the townships and cities own the ambulance service and they are in the process of updating the agreement for a formal joint powers. At this time, Hobart Township is not part of this agreement, but the ambulance does serve the Township. With the process of forming the joint powers, Hobart Township could become part of the joint powers. A draft of the joint powers was given to the Board members and they were asked to attend the 11/16/10 meeting at the Ambulance Station to find out more information. This meeting would be held at 6:00 p.m. Further discussion was held regarding the joint powers board, how the ambulance service operates and types of services. It was pointed out that if the Township did not join the joint powers, the Township would receive the same level of service and care but could be charged a surcharge. The consensus of the Board was that they would attend the meeting for more information.

Since there was no further business to come before the Board, Hockett adjourned the meeting.
