

**Hobart Township Annual Meeting
March 11, 2104**

17 people were present for the meeting.

Clerk Debi Moltzan called the meeting to order at 8:15 p.m. R Sonnenberg made a motion to nominate Marv Anderson as moderator. Marv Anderson made a motion to nominate Dennis Pausch as moderator. A coin toss was done, with Marv Anderson winning the coin toss. Marv Anderson to be the 2014 moderator.

Anderson led everyone in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Clerk Moltzan read the minutes from the 2013 annual meeting. Dennis Pausch made a motion to approve the minutes as read. Terry Hockett second. All in favor. Motion carried.

Treasurer Glawe gave the Treasurer's report. Bev Hockett made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report as given. R Sonnenberg second. All in favor. Motion carried.

The Supervisor's gave an update on the Town Hall project and what was left to be done. The flooring needs to be installed and well drilled, both of which are to be done within the next two weeks. There are some minor deficiencies that the contractors need to fix, but they are working on them. R Sonnenberg brought up the idea of tarring the parking lot once done and ready. Rod Boyer felt that the hall would stay cleaner with a tarred parking lot. R Sonnenberg suggested that the parking lot would be paid for out of the road and bridge fund. R Sonnenberg also stated that a settling basin to catch storm water run off will be constructed near the site of the old hall. R Sonnenberg thanked D Sonnenberg, Rod Boyer and Debi Moltzan for working on and seeing the town hall project through.

The town hall open house was discussed. Moltzan explained that if town funds were to be used to hold an open house, it needed to be decided upon at the annual meeting. After much discussion, Rod Boyer made a motion to set an open house for Saturday, May 3, 2014 with the time and final details to be decided by the Town Board. D Sonnenberg second. All in favor. Motion carried. Boyer stated that Rodney Hanson is working on an article about Hobart Township, which will be published in the Frazee Paper and suggested that the Board do the same to advertise the open house.

The levies for 2015 were discussed. The Supervisors felt that the levies for the general fund and fire fund were alright were they are set now, but felt that the road and bridge should be increased to accommodate for additional snow plowing and new signs. Dennis Pausch made a motion to set the general fund at \$60,000; the road and bridge fund at \$225,000; and the fire fund at \$60,000. Rod Boyer second. All in favor. Motion carried.

Donations were discussed. Dennis Pausch gave an update on the Neighbor to Neighbor

program. Marv Anderson gave an update on the status of the Frazee Rescue Department. Brikkar Ware gave an update on the Frazee Fire Department.

Rod Boyer made a motion to donate the following funds:

Dennis Pausch second. All in favor. Motion carried.

The 2015 annual election and meeting will be held on the second Tuesday of March. Dennis Pausch made a motion to set the election hours from 4:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. with the annual meeting to be held at 8:15 p.m, both of which are to take place at the Hobart Town Hall. D Sonnenberg second. All in favor.

Moltzan explained that the Township is now connected with Instant Alert and told the residents how to get signed up for that.

Since there was no further business to come before the residents of Hobart Township, Dennis Pausch made a motion to adjourn the meeting. R Sonnenberg second. All in favor. Motion carried.; Meeting adjourned at 9:15 p.m.
