

**Hobart Township Monthly Meeting
May 10, 2016**

Present: Ray Sonnenberg, DuWayne Sonnenberg, Terry Hockett, Debi Moltzan, Kathy Glawe, Jeff Stabnow, Marv Heisler, Kurt Janu, George May, Dave and Shaun Olson, Jim Peterson and Perry Marcus.

Chairman Hockett called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

R Sonnenberg made a motion to approve the minutes from the April 2016 meeting. D Sonnenberg second. All in favor. Motion carried.

D Sonnenberg made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report. R Sonnenberg second. All in favor. Motion carried.

Jeff Stabnow stated that 4 bids were received for the Camp Cherith Road paving project and opened the sealed bids. Bids were received from Anderson Brothers of Brainerd, Central Specialties of Alexandria, Mark Sand and Gravel of Fergus Falls and Tri-City Paving of Little Falls. Stabnow reviewed and verified each of the bids for compliance with the RFP.

While Stabnow was verifying the bids, the disbursements were reviewed. R Sonnenberg made a motion to pay the disbursements as presented. D Sonnenberg second. All in favor. Motion carried.

Supervisor updates included discussion about the road tour and gravel needed in which locations, culvert work to being on Wymer Lake (verbal estimate of \$3200), and approving three (3) new approach permits.

Sherry Blaine questioned what could be done about the speeding traffic on W Wymer Lake Road, stating that there was a couple of speed limit signs missing and if speed bumps could be installed. The Supervisors suggested that she call the Sheriff's department and report the description of the vehicles and if they were repeat vehicles, a time in which the Sheriff should be in the area.

Stabnow stated that he had finished verifying the bids and the lowest bid was Central Specialties. Stabnow explained the process of what needed to be done next and the following steps. Stabnow stated, that if the Board accepted this bid, that he would be monitoring the project to make sure it met the specifications and was done correctly and timely.

George May questioned how the bid compared to the engineer's estimate and if there would be any special assessments. The Board explained that there would be no special assessments because it is an existing tarred road that needed to be resurfaced and that the bid was lower than the engineer's estimate.

Discussion was held on rocking portions of the ditches before road work was to begin and borrowing the money to pay for the project. R Sonnenberg made a motion to borrow \$300,000

approved

to complete the road project. D Sonnenberg second. All in favor. Motion carried. Glawe would check into the procedure for bonding the money for the project.

R Sonnenberg made a motion to accept the bid from Central Specialties for the Camp Cherith Road project. D Sonnenberg second. All in favor. Motion carried.

Dustguard will be applied once the roads are graveled and bladed into shape.

Since there was no further business to come before the Board, Hockett adjourned the meeting.
